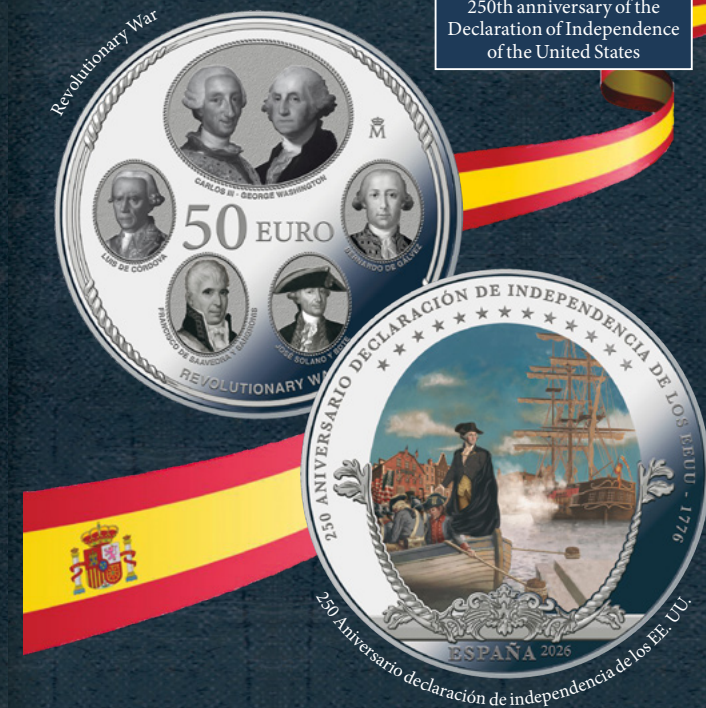
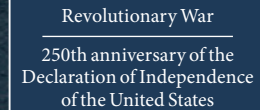

Revolutionary War

We the People

of the United States, in order to secure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common Defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Article 1.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year in each State, in such Manner, the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch in each State shall have.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years, and who shall not, when elected, be seven Years.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including Indians not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons.

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and within every subsequent Term of ten Years, in such Manner as they shall by Law direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand, but each State shall have at least one Representative.

When vacancies happen in the Representation from any State, the Electors in that State shall choose another in the Manner in which the Electors in that State shall have directed.

The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State for six Years; and each Senator shall have one Vote.

Immediately after they shall be assembled in Consequence of the Election, they shall be divided into three equal Classes. In each Class, one Senator shall have a Term of two Years, one of four Years, and one of six Years; and in each Class, one Senator shall be chosen in the Manner in which the Electors in that State shall have directed.

When vacancies happen in the Senate from the Death of a Senator, or from any other Cause, the Legislature of the State may fill the Vacancies in the Manner in which the Electors in that State shall have directed.

The Vice President of the United States shall be chosen in the Manner in which the Electors in that State shall have directed.

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
